

Reflection: Jesus signed his death warrant when he cast commerce out of the temple. He stood up for the truth about God and about religion and the poor, as the businesspeople of the temple were exploiting the poor with high prices. Lent gives us new insights into how Jesus lived his life, always within the shadow of his death. Even this scene at the start of the gospel has us remembering that this would lead him to death and to glory. The glory of God here is Jesus fully alive to the exploitation of the poor, the mistreatment of the house of God, and fully alive to the faith that was beginning to grow in his disciples. Our prayer today might be to remember all who suffer and are endangered in their commitment to justice and right religion.



The Issue of Abortion is very emotive. The position of the Church is not to condemn the mother but to love both mother and child. Enabling vulnerable Mums to get support in our old presbytery is one way of doing this – a project so well run by Homestart with 6 Mums there continuously.

On March 4th Diana Johnson and Stella Creasy want to amend 2 laws: - The Person Act 1861 and Infant Life Preservation Act 1929, that are used to protect the unborn child. Without these acts, there would be no sanction against a doctor or parent who aborts a baby up to birth (even on the grounds of gender).



Most countries in Europe (22 of them) have an abortion limit of 12 weeks gestation. In the UK it is 24 weeks. This amendment would effectively make abortion permissible up to birth.

The Church loves and values the unborn child (the most vulnerable of all) and believes that better ways must be found to support mothers in difficult circumstances. Abortion is damaging for mothers and deadly for unborn children. Please write and express your concerns about this amendment to the law to your local MP this week.

In stark contrast, the BBC announced last week that ministers have listened to be eaved parents who have gone through the

painful experience of miscarriage. Campaigners said they were "thrilled" that millions of families would finally get the formal acknowledgement that their baby existed in the form of a certificate. This is for babies up to 24 weeks since those after that are registered as 'still-births'.

No-one has suggested a certificate for babies who have been aborted.

If we don't speak up for them, who will?

Heart of Tamworth offers many opportunities to volunteer in the centre - Drivers, café, reception...


With the opening of the 'Vintage Clothing' shop, we need to recruit volunteers to help run it. So:

That way, it can be gift aided (government adds 25% from tax-payers to increase the donation). If all our loose money was gift aided it would increase our collection by £7,000 per annum at no cost to you. That's a big increase and would cover a loss we made last year.
