

**Some Reflections on the Future:** The Church in our Diocese is about to change. Whether it is for the better will depend on us. We know that we face declining numbers of priests. This has involved employing more people, developing buildings, liturgy, evangelisation and developing our charity work. With the parish council, we brought in annual reports, more consultation and more opportunities for people to get involved.

This also fits in with what Pope Francis is calling us to, a renewed Church in which we are mission focussed and respecting the calling of every baptised person.
