Struggling with energy debt?

Individuals and families can apply for grants to clear domestic gas and electricity debts. Before applying to the Trust you must get money or debt advice first. The British Gas Energy Trust would encourage you to contact your local Money Advice Agency for help before applying for a grant. If you get advice, this will help your chances of a successful grant application.

Criteria that must be met to be eligible:

- Have energy debt up to £2,000 and have a credit energy account OR use a Pre-Payment Meter in your main residence and the energy account must be in the name of the applicant
- You live in England, Scotland, or Wales
- You have not received a grant from the British Gas Energy Trust within the last 2 years
- You must be seeking a grant to clear an outstanding debt on a current or open gas, electricity or dual fuel energy account in your name and the energy account must relate to your main residence.
- You have electric and/or gas debt
- You must be in or facing Fuel Poverty
- You have received help from a money advice agency

FAMILY PRACTITIONER SERVICE PARENT SUPPORT

The Family Practitioner Service is currently taking referrals from schools for the following support sessions they are running: -

- Teen Parenting Programme this is a six-week programme for parents and carers of 11-17 years old. It covers communication, home rules, safety, peer pressure and how to manage challenging situation. A course started on the 10th January but, there will be further courses running.
- Young Parents Support Group over an 8-week rolling cycle a range of topics will be explored to help teenage and first-time parents including; child development, sleep routines, feeding and weaning, play and interaction, childhood immunisations and health, financial advice and budgeting and looking after yourself. Babies and toddlers are welcome at these sessions. This currently runs every Wednesday afternoon from 12.30 2.30 pm

BELGRAVE CLUB PARKING - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Please note the following changes to parking arrangements at Belgrave Club.

- ANY PARKING PASSES ISSUED BY SCHOOL ARE NO LONGER VALID
- ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) will be in operation controlled by Parkingeye
- Unfortunately, at this stage, we have not been provided with any other information regarding the new terms and conditions
- Any parents/carers choosing to park at Belgrave Club are strongly encouraged to check parking terms and conditions directly with the Club

<u>Parking</u>

The council have now placed wooden posts on the grass verge on the side of Wilnecote Lane to prevent parking there.

You will also note that Staffordshire Police have provided us with some signage to encourage parents and carers not to park on or block Wilnecote Lane and the school driveway.

- Please continue to be aware of the need to park responsibly in the local area and around the school. Parking is not allowed in front of the school gates.
- The yellow lines and zig zags are there to stop people parking there and to protect and keep all of our children safe.
- Please never park up on the footpaths in the surrounding roads.
- You are asked to please show consideration to local home owners and do not block garages and driveways. Please do not become abusive to local home owners.
- Parking on the grass verge along Wilnecote Lane has been raised as a COMPLAINT with local police. We have been asked to advise all parents not to do this. Parking on the grass verges is dangerous and causes blockage for neighbours.

We have received complaints from several businesses situated on the Seaton Industrial Estate: "Over the past several months, we have noticed an increase in parents parking their vehicles on our industrial estate while dropping off or picking up their children from St Gabriel's School. While we understand the importance of ensuring the safety of students, the overflow of vehicles onto our property has become a persistent problem. This unauthorized parking disrupts our daily operations in several ways:

- 1. Restricted Access: Parents' vehicles block access to our service entrances and parking spaces designated for our employees and clients. This impedes the timely delivery and shipment of goods, leading to delays in production and customer service.
- 2. Safety Hazards: The additional traffic and congestion caused by parked vehicles on our estate create safety hazards for both pedestrians and drivers. This jeopardizes the well-being of our employees and visitors.
- 3. Business Disruption: The disruptions to our operations have a negative impact on our productivity, and it also reflects poorly on our reputation when we are unable to meet our commitments to clients due to these parking issues."

Please do not park on the Industrial Estate.

Local councillors continue to be involved and taking an active interest because of irresponsible driving behaviour by a small minority. Thank you to the majority of our parents and carers who continue to park lawfully and sensibly.
