Actions during Lent

There is a lot of encouragement this year to simply know God better through prayer. We always have fasting and almsgiving too, but this year there will be a special emphasis on prayer. Here is what is on offer:

- Nightly rosary, prayed on the parish Youtube channel at 8pm every evening - just 15minutes each night for Lent.
- An excellent prayer app called Hallow. The parish has paid for all parishioners to get this through Lent. We have paid £200 so that you will get it for just 75p each. It offers all sorts of ways of helping us pray, with daily reflections too.
- Daily Mass, plus Friday Lenten soup lunch in support of CAFOD - 12 noon Mass at St John's.
- Homilies on prayer for the first Sundays of Lent in which we are encouraged and taught how to pray.
- Walk With Me Booklets.
- This year we will also have Bible Alive booklets available with more scripture and prayer.
- Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings.

Each class has a prayer bag that the children will be bringing home during Lent. This is an opportunity to spend a short time as a family praying together.

Please ensure you read the information in the bag as the bags vary depending on what year group your children are in. Measles

Cases of measles are rising across England, including among children. It's an infection that spreads very easily, especially in nurseries and schools if children are not vaccinated. It can be a very unpleasant illness and, in some children, can be very serious and lead to hospitalisation - and in rare cases tragically can cause death.

There's no specific medical treatment for measles, so it's important to get vaccinated as it's the best protection against becoming seriously unwell and helps prevent the spread in the community.

The measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine is one of the [routine childhood vaccinations](#), so most children are already vaccinated against measles. If your child has received both doses of the vaccine, they are unlikely to have the virus.

We are calling on all parents and carers to make sure their children are up to date with their 2 MMR doses. To see if your child is up to date with their MMR vaccines, check your child's personal child health record, known as the 'red book', or contact your GP practice.

Children who are unvaccinated and come into contact with a case will need to stay away from school or nursery for up to 21 days.

It is never too late to catch up. The MMR vaccine is free, whatever your age. If anyone has missed one or both doses of the MMR vaccine, contact your GP practice to book an appointment.

Measles is a highly infectious viral illness, so to prevent the illness spreading further, anyone with symptoms is advised to stay at home and phone their GP or NHS 111 for advice, rather than visiting the GP practice or A&E.

Measles usually starts with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash a few days later. Some people may also get small spots in their mouth. Find out more on the [NHS website](#).

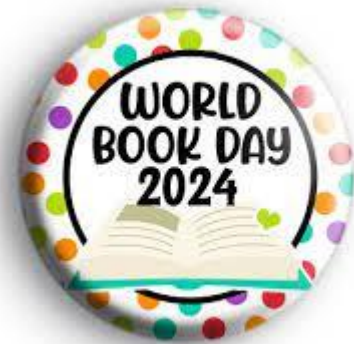
Well Done Readers of the Week!

In the interests of encouraging reading for pleasure, we are also planning for children to take part in a book swap (in their own year group) during the day. If your child has any unwanted books, books they have grown out of or one they have simply read too many times, they can bring it into school and swap it for another book of their choice from one of their school friends. Please make sure your child understands that they will be exchanging their book so another child will be taking their book home!!

We will also be setting a World Book Day related Home Learning task after the half term holiday, the results of which the children will share with one another on World Book Day. In school children will also be taking part in the Design a National Book token competition and the two winning designs from each class will be entered into the national competition.
