Advice

As parents, you want a child to be happy and resilient. We want them to see the opportunities in our world.

However, as human beings, we are programmed to see, notice and remember the negatives more than the positives.

A big strategy to coach and encourage is to shift our attention to the positives, without ignoring the negatives.

So 3 tips.

1. Practice being GRATEFUL.

Encourage your child to APPRECIATE the good things in their lives - no matter how big or small.

Do this by asking them to share 3 THINGS they are glad of or appreciate towards the end of each day.

2. REFRAME challenges.

See setbacks as opportunities for growth, rather than being FRUSTRATED or ASHAMED.

Ask your child to reflect on what they learned from their mistakes or remind them of other times when they overcame obstacles.

3. CELEBRATE STRENGTHS

Recognise and encourage the unique strengths and talents your child has. Every child has them. Help them develop them further.

Praise them for their EFFORTS, not just achievements.

We can all benefit from these.

And never underestimate as a parent the difference you can make just by giving your child some TIME. Just a little quality few minutes each day.

Enrichment Activities and Attendance

It is really encouraging to see the amount of enrichment activities the children are attending at weekends and evenings and this is something that we actively encourage for every child. However, we are noticing more and more that after these activities, children are not attending school because they are over-tired.

Whilst we fully appreciate that children will be tired, it is important to ensure that their attendance at school is not affected. Additionally, it is an ideal opportunity to build resilience, as we all recognise that there are things we need to do, as adults, even when we are over-tired!

I would really appreciate your support and understanding with this issue.

Attendance

Parents of children with attendance below 90% have been written to recently.

The attendance of our children at school has received a massive blow due to the Covid pandemic. It has always been parents/carers legal duty to get children into school regularly, this is even more vital now due to the disruption to the children's learning. For this reason, it is so important that your child is in school for every educational hour possible AND THAT WE RE ESTABLISH OUR BEST POSSIBLE ATTENDANCE.

NO HOLIDAYS CAN BE APPROVED. I would ask that any routine appointments are made out of school hours and that you consider very carefully any absence from school. We don't want the education of our children to suffer any more than it has done already.

Our expectations for attendance are as per our published Attendance Policy which you can find here, we would encourage you to read and understand this.

Current attendance for the school year so far

Overall 94.57% (5/9/22-28/04/23)

Attendance overall, as shown above, is slowly creeping upwards.

We need to improve the attendance of our pupils, particularly our youngest pupils. Thank you.

Visitors in School

We have been very lucky over the last weeks to be able to welcome a number of visitors into school!

Severn Trent Water - Super Sewers!

We welcomed a special visit from Severn Trent Water this week!

Lucy came into school to talk to us about Super Sewers and how we can all help to use water carefully and sustainably.

Lucy explained that it was really important that we remembered that there are 'Only Three Things that should go down the loo - toilet paper, pee and poo.'

Following our assemblies, we have made a commitment that we will 'Only put the 3Ps down the loo and not pour any Fats, Oils or Greases down the sink to help look after our environment.' This commitment will help us to Live Sustainably and to Work for the Common Good - If we all care and share for water then we can all have enough of this life giving resource.

CAFOD - Catholic Social Teaching Workshops

We also welcomed Barbara from CAFOD into school to lead a number of Catholic Social Teaching Workshops.

Catholic social teaching (CST) is rooted in Scripture, formed by the wisdom of Church leaders, and influenced by grassroots movements. It is our moral compass, guiding us on how to live out our faith in the world.

Barbara talked to us about the different aspects of Catholic Social Teaching and how we could put the teaching into practice in our daily lives.

Snapchat

We have been made aware of a feature within the SnapChat app, called My AI Robot, which may not be completely safe. This feature may be able to access users location, regardless of whether the location identification tool has been disabled.

If you child has access to this application, we recommend that parents/carers check the use of the app in view of this.

Please be clear, children in primary should not have access to SnapChat as it has a recommended user age of 13+.

Parking

Local Councillor Paul Thompson and a representative of the local police team visited school on Thursday March 30^{th} . Developments are expected as a result.

Please continue to be aware of the need to park responsibly in the local area and around the school. Thank you to the majority of parents who continue to park lawfully and sensibly. Parking is not allowed in front of the school gates, the yellow lines and zig zags are there to stop people parking there and to protect and keep all of our children safe.

Please never park up on the footpaths in the surrounding roads. You are also asked to please show consideration to local home owners and do not block garages and driveways. Please do not become abusive to local home owners. Parking on the grass verge along Wilnecote Lane has been raised as a COMPLAINT with local police. We have been asked to advise all parents not to do this. Parking on the grass verges is dangerous and causes blockage for neighbours. Local police will be following this up. Thank you.
