



Church Giving: We are doing the accounts for 2023 and will present these in due course. Thank-you for supporting the parish. 'Loose money' in the collection has increased. It makes a

big difference. But can people who give this way please swap to standing orders? It makes a big difference. But can people who give this way please swap to standing orders? It means no counting, banking and security issues. That way, it can also be gift aided (government adds 25% from taxpayers to increase the donation). Whether it's £1 a week or £20, if all our loose money was gift aided it would increase our collection by **£7,000 per annum** at no cost to those who donate. That's a big increase and would cover a loss we made last year. Forms can be found in the church porch.
